Labeling & Tracking

- ▶ Subchapter 1: General Provisions
 - ▶ Licensed entities cannot sell, distribute, or transfer medical marijuana that is not packaged and labeled as required
- ▶ Subchapter 2: Packaging Requirements
 - ▶ Not attractive to minors
 - ▶ “Keep out of reach of children”
 - ▶ Child resistant packaging
 - ▶ Only neutral colors (black/white/gray/beige)
 - ▶ No use of primary or secondary colors
 - ▶ Product is fully enclosed

Labeling & Tracking

- ▶ Subchapter 3: Labelling requirements
 - ▶ Plain black font
 - ▶ Labelled when entering retail space
 - ▶ Batch number, weight, ingredients
 - ▶ THC percentage, CBD percentage
 - ▶ “Tested for contaminants”

Labeling & Tracking

- ▶ Subchapter 4: Edible Products
 - ▶ Must meet general requirements also
 - ▶ Ingredients list, food allergen information
- ▶ Subchapter 5: Labelling for Sales between cultivators and manufacturers
 - ▶ Name and license number, batch number, date of harvest or production

Labeling & Tracking

- ▶ Subchapter 6: warnings at point of sale in retail settings
 - ▶ Examples
 - ▶ “For Medical Use Only. Store in locked location away from children.”
 - ▶ “Not for resale. For medical use by registered patients only.”
 - ▶ “Marijuana may be habit forming and addictive.”
 - ▶ “Do not operate a vehicle or machinery under the influence of marijuana.”
 - ▶ “Marijuana should not be used by women who are pregnant or breastfeeding.”
 - ▶ “Smoking and vaporizing are hazardous to your health.”
 - ▶ “Vaping can expose you to toxic chemicals.”

Labeling & Tracking

- ▶ Subchapter 7: Tracking requirements
 - ▶ Use of electronic system for continuous inventory control
 - ▶ Document tall transfers, sales, movement within physical spaces
 - ▶ Inventory review and traceability to detect diversion, theft, or loss
 - ▶ Track entire lifespan (seed to sale)
 - ▶ Transportation manifests
 - ▶ Confirmation of patient purchases to ensure limits on allowable amounts are in compliance
 - ▶ Reporting requirements
 - ▶ Continuous electronic process

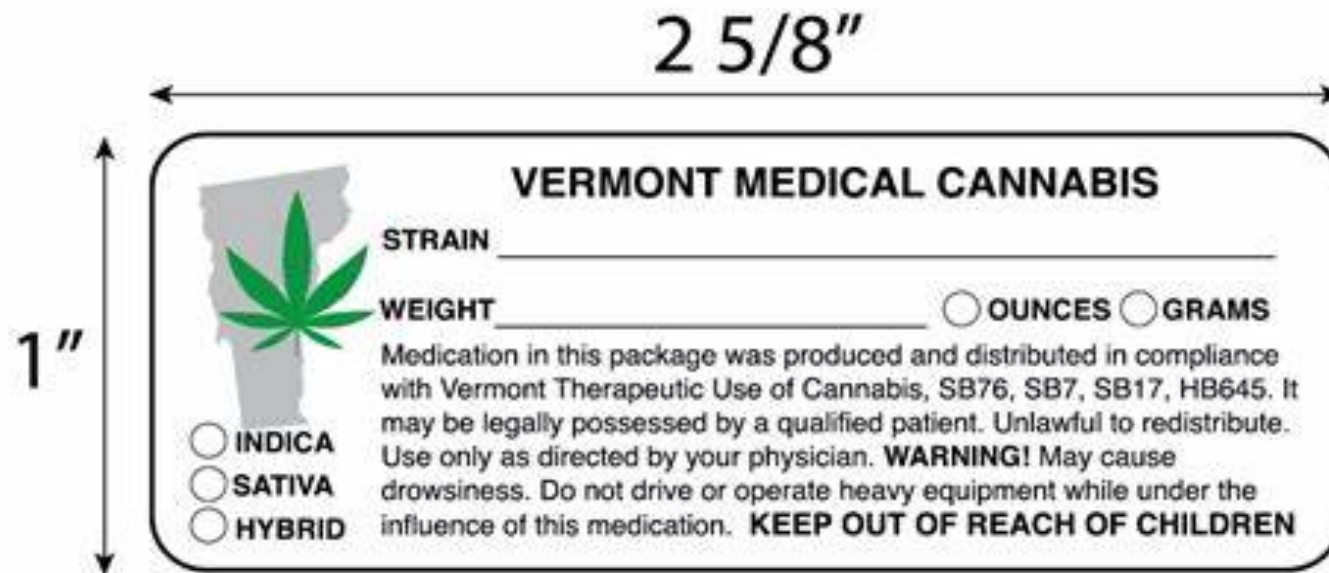
RECOMMENDED NOTICE

TAGGING SYSTEM

- ▶ Unique Identifier Numbers
- ▶ Plant Tags
 - ▶ Individual and Batches
- ▶ Packages Tags
 - ▶ Groups of items for transfer or sale
 - ▶ Unique ID for package
- ▶ Scan-able Barcodes
 - ▶ Tag order date
 - ▶ License Number
 - ▶ Facility name

RECORD KEEPING AND REPORTING

- ▶ All plants and products
- ▶ Changes in rooms or growth phases
- ▶ Inventory transfers
- ▶ Discrepancies
 - ▶ Ex. Gap between harvested amount to sales amount OR sales vs. assessments paid
- ▶ Waste records
- ▶ Lab results
- ▶ Sales
